- Yvonne said Alex came in about 10am and said S-J was vomitting and diaria all last night. Yvonne did take S-J's temperature, but S-J didn't appear to have a major temperature. After much persuasion, Alex eventually went to see doctor.
- Yvonne eventually got Alex about 10/c, she said she's been to the doctor's and doctor said she's got a flu. What concerned Yvonne was that Alex brought S-J into centre as if nothing's wrong with S-J and yet boasting about S-J being sick.
- Yvonne feels that Alex needs mothering herself, she craves for attention all the time, She calls for attention almost every 5 minutes, demanding more attention for herself than S-J.
- Alex didn't mention to Yvonne she got letter from me.
- Yvonne said, before today, although S-J looked pale, but she didn't have runny nose, cough or anything of the sort. She is concerned that in the space of 1 month, S-J's been sick 3 times.
- Yvonne also mentioned that this week, when she changed S-J, she noticed sore marks on either side of her hips, which looked as though nappies' been put on too tight, and bad rash on her left bottom.
- Yvonne said she noticed S-J very rarely smile or appear happy. She ~~can~~ could say a few words, but she doesn't appear to understand other words or have the wish to communicate. She doesn't like being washed, changed or touched and cuddled. She is contented to play along side other children but not play with them.

The room is warm, but when she xopened the fridge, the fridge was cluttered with food and she said she was going to give Sarah-Jane some baked beans. There were 2-2pint cartoon of full cream milk in the fridge. - The son of a friend of hers came in during the interview, he said he wasn't at school because he had chicken pots. - When I tried to discuss the contract with Alex, Alex said she had to see her friend Val, and left me with this 6-year old boy. - Alex was friendly, and said she was enjoying the nursery. She said Sarah-Jane was sick, but is alot better now. - Paul is alright and everything was going well.

10/1/91	T/C Dr Jacobs concerned re Sara Jane's welfare. T/C Jacud Andover Nursery - Sara Jane had not been to nursery and had therefore not been taken to clinic. Visit with Alan Beer S/W to Alex and Sara Jane at Holloway Road Reception Centre. Alex was watching TV. SJ in the cot. She would not come to me when I put my arms out to her but she was ok about being picked up ie she did not respond to a cue but does not object when you hold her. She was cheerful, smiling and gurgling. Her nappy was very wet and urine seemed strong. She had no socks on and when we were going out there were none to put on her even though I asked Alex said she had fed her a meal but chips were in evidence and SJ was fed them cold. Lots of small cartons of long life milk were about and we talked about the concerns of Yvonne at the nursery that Alex was giving SJ stale milk. Alex said SJ had six bottles a day. Alex admitted there were problems again around money. She said she had no money today she is only doing voluntary work on a Saturday now. She gets lonely when SJ is at nursery all day. She said SJ is not going because of a cough. But SJ had no sign of a cough. Real reasons (1) Alex loneliness and nursery won't let her stay with SJ and eat lunch there. (2) Finds the staff too critical. I suggested meeting with parents/staff and s/w next week and emphasised strongly the importance of SJ attending nursery. We took them to the clinic and saw the health visitor. SJ remains on 3rd percentile. She is starting to walk. Alex was not attentive to the need to chase SJ around and Alan did most of this. I am concerned because SJ must remain in her cot most of the time because of the unsuitable nature of living in one room. There are safety concerns. I suggest involving Environmental Health Officer again. Room could have been in a worse state but that is not saying much to say I have seen their flat in a worse state.

Date: 27/11/90 Visited Alex at the centre late in the afternoon. Alex wasn't in her room. Waited in the staff room. Staff informed me that Alex was asking them to show her how to feed S-J. Staff explained to her they haven't got the time and she should be looking after her own child. Staff said they have already helped family filled in Housing Benefit form and returned it to St George's N.O. But rent for centre is very high = £90 per person per week, which meant that if people were earning then they had to pay horrendous amount towards rent. Neighbour said she knocked on Alex door again no reply. Neighbour said she was concerned, as Alex didn't have a clue of knowing how to handle S-J or feed baby. Baby ~~didn't~~ dirtied her outfit after feeding. Alex didn't even bother to bath her or change her. She thought baby wasn't Alex's, and she complained that Alex was knocking on her door every 5 minutes to ask for her. She said she'd like to help but not in that way as she has children of her own. Neighbour said she'll and her family will move out this Friday.

- She said she saw Alex and Sarah-Jane this afternoon. Sarah-Jane lost even more weight this week, now 7.9kg. Since 28/9 S-J's weight gone down from 8.16kg to 7.93kg, which is what she weighed since beginning of September. *lost* About 8oz in all.
- Alex couldn't think of a reason for why S-J lost weight last week, but this week she said S-J vomitted once. Gone through with her again intake of food.
- Dr Jacobs said developmentally S-J is at a plateau, she haven't seen new development for a few weeks. Dr Jacobs said, children of her age, we should be able to observe new development almost daily, but in the case of S-J one day is much like the next. Not thriving as ~~she~~ should. She could see there is a bond with Alex, but Alex not talking about S-J as a personality.
- It is abnormal that S-J should be weighed everyweek and A. should be told about food intake each week.
- I asked her how babies are weighed in her clinic, she said if its children of one year and under, they are stripped, but S-J was weighed in light clothing, but that should not make much difference to her weight.
- If condition continues, she's thinking of talking to the paediatrician at Whittington Hospital about admitting S-J.
